FOOD DONATIONS GROW:

In 2003, the St. Louis Area Foodbank distributed 12.8 million pounds of food (11.6 million in 2002).

Our partnership with the food industry, and the community remains the conduit for mission success.

Our largest event of the year, **Scouting for Food**, collected over 2 million cans

from the local community. As in past years, items collected in St. Louis City and County were delivered to the Foodbank for distribution through our member agencies.

Just as the Scouting for Food collections helped sustain us during the winter months, the 11th annual **National Association of Letter Carriers' Food Drive** arrived in May

and delivered nearly 312,000 pounds of food - helping stock our shelves for summer.

PROGRAMS GROW:

The **Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)** was awarded to the Foodbank in 2002. And, in 2003, we were granted 1,000 additional caseloads bringing the grand total to 4,500 monthly food boxes. The

How 'bout some change?

Dear Friends,

In order to best serve our community in need, the Foodbank must readily adapt to change. And throughout our history, we've done just that.

But you should expect that from an organization that has been around since 1975. From changes in the food industry to changes in food-handling requirements, we've adapted.

However, despite all these changes over these past 29 years, one constant has remained. Need. Need continues in our community just as it did in 1975. Our founders created the Foodbank to help under-nourished pregnant woman in order to combat the rise in low birthweight babies. Now, we're seeing people in need that can be categorized as "the working poor" - single-parent families struggling to make ends meet while working 40 or more hours a week at minimum wage with little or no health benefits. And sadly, as has been the case for a number of years now, children continue to comprise the largest segment of people in need of the assistance we provide. In short, the faces may have changed, but the need remains.

Thankfully, as we have changed, you've stayed the same. You recognize the growing need for food assistance in our community and you continue to be supportive of our efforts. Whether you contribute money, food, or time, your efforts have enabled us to adapt to the changing faces of hunger and for that we cannot thank you enough.

We promise to continue making the most of the generosity you so graciously entrust to the St. Louis Area Foodbank and vow to continue making the changes necessary to meet the growing need.

success of this program relies on the commitment of our volunteers. From individuals, to groups, nearly 3,000 volunteers spent more than 7,000 hours sorting and packaging CSFP boxes for local seniors in need.

Through a grant awarded in late 2002 from the Missouri Foundation for Health, the Foodbank was able to begin its **Hunger Outreach and Public Education (HOPE)** program. In 2003, HOPE reached more than 80 food pantry member agencies teaching them about Missouri's food stamp program and other benefits for which their clients may be eligible.

PARTNERSHIPS GROW: The City of St. Louis was awarded \$1,000 for its past and current efforts to combat hunger and homelessness. The funds - awarded by the Congressional Hunger Center - were then presented directly to the St. Louis Area Foodbank. The City received the grant through a nomination made by

Congressman Dick Gephardt. "Every member of Congress is given an opportunity to nominate organizations in their communities to receive one of the **Victory Against Hunger Awards**. I'm honored that the City of St. Louis was chosen for an award this year," said Congressman Gephardt.

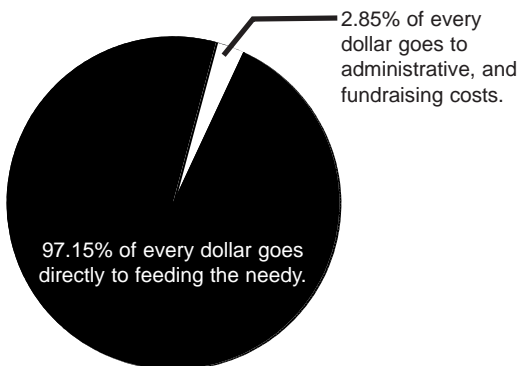
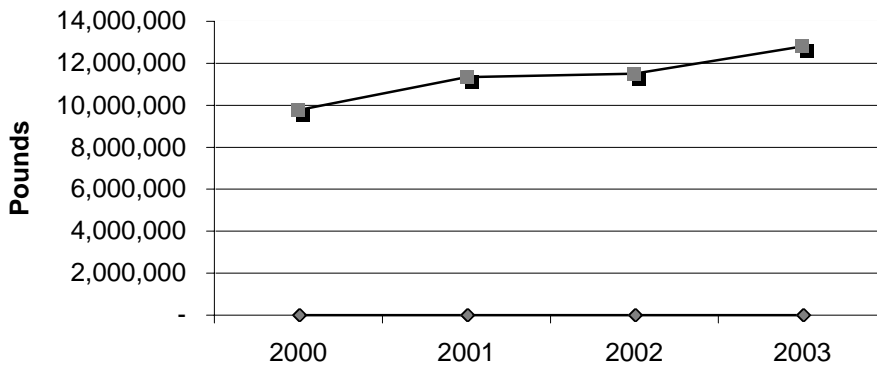
