



**2005 IN REVIEW:**

**FOODBANK STAFFER VOLUNTEERS FOR EXTENDED DISASTER RELIEF EFFORTS:**

When America's Second Harvest asked the St. Louis Area Foodbank to provide a truck and driver to help out for several weeks in the hurricane-impacted area, Larry Simms, center in the picture to the left, volunteered to be the one to do it.



"When my boss asked us drivers if one of us would go, I thought about it all day long," said Larry. "I saw the pictures of the storm and kept thinking 'I wish I could do something to help.' So, I didn't feel good until I said I would go. I had never been further south than Atlanta!"

Larry left for Baton Rouge on September 3rd with a truck loaded with eight pallets of Capri Sun, assorted crackers and other snacks we had available at our warehouse. He left St. Louis around

9:30 a.m. and arrived around 10 p.m. at a temporary warehouse set up for the New Orleans Foodbank. He was sent down there with a bag of clothes, some snacks, a few toiletries, his willingness to work and a lot of hope.

Larry delivered pallets of produce to agencies set up to help in the areas around New Orleans and throughout Louisiana and Mississippi. He averaged 300 miles per day, 10 to 12 hours a day, 7 days a week for three weeks! He slept in the warehouse on a cot along with drivers from other food banks. "There were drivers from all over the place," says Larry. "From New York, Pennsylvania, Arizona, and California."

"I was shocked at times by the damage," Larry noted. "I remember making a delivery to Franklinton, LA, which I thought was far from where the storm hit. But, it looked like a tornado had set down there. Trees were blocking the roads and everything."

Larry said that people he met were real

nice and many asked him to send pictures. When Hurricane Rita hit communities like Lake Charles, where he had worked, he thought about many of the people he had met and hoped they were okay.

Larry returned to St. Louis on September 22nd. "It's neat to know I had a chance to help," he said.

**CURRENT YEAR LOCAL STORM RELIEF UPDATE**

The help we provided to the Gulf Coast is important. But, it's also important to help here at home too. In the wake of the recent storms and

power outages, the St. Louis Area Foodbank joined efforts with the United Way to bring 50,000 emergency food boxes for those impacted.

"The Foodbank helps feed more than 60,000 local individuals each week," said Frank Finnegan, executive director of the St. Louis Area Foodbank. "Our challenge now - in addition to this effort - is to replenish items lost at many of the over 500 community partner agencies we serve so they can continue helping us in our mission to feed hungry people."

As a supporter, you already know that the Foodbank provides food for pantries, soup kitchens and other emergency feeding programs. However, during this crisis, the Foodbank made its Repackaging Center in Overland a food box distribution location for families in need.

### ALL ABOARD THE TURKEY TRAIN!

Upper School students at Mary Institute and Saint Louis Country Day School (MICDS) joined together before the 2005 holiday season to form a "Turkey Train" during a special all-school assembly. Each student brought a frozen turkey to school for the St. Louis Area Foodbank and formed a line to the Foodbank trucks waiting to receive the turkeys as they were passed one-by-one from student to student. Close to 600 turkeys and several hundred canned food items were collected for the Foodbank.

### CARDINALS' WIVES HIT IT OUT OF THE BALLPARK WITH FOOD AND FUND DRIVE FOR FOODBANK

At the Cardinals games over the 2005 Memorial Day weekend, fans entering Busch Stadium at each entrance were welcomed by a Cardinal wife and Foodbank representatives. Fans making a food or financial donation received a unique Busch Stadium historical card in exchange for their generosity. The best fans in baseball donated \$10,000 and thousands of canned goods to benefit the St. Louis Area Foodbank.

Foodbank friend, Lorrie Isringhausen (wife of ace closer Jason Isringhausen) "pitched" the idea to the Cardinals and the wives, and organized everything on their end.

### GOVERNOR BLUNT VOLUNTEERS AT FOODBANK REPACKAGING CENTER

In support of his Show-Me Solutions initiative, Missouri Governor Matt Blunt visited the St. Louis Area Foodbank in October and spent time repackaging donated food for distribution to the local community in need. After volunteering, Governor Blunt addressed the media explaining the importance of

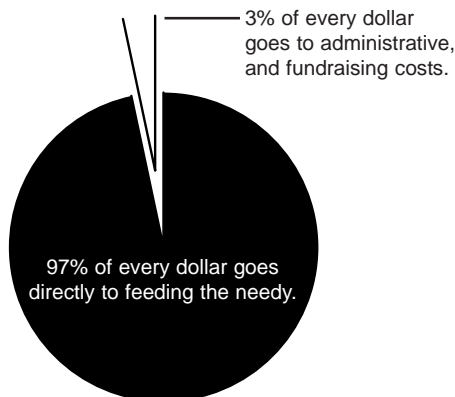
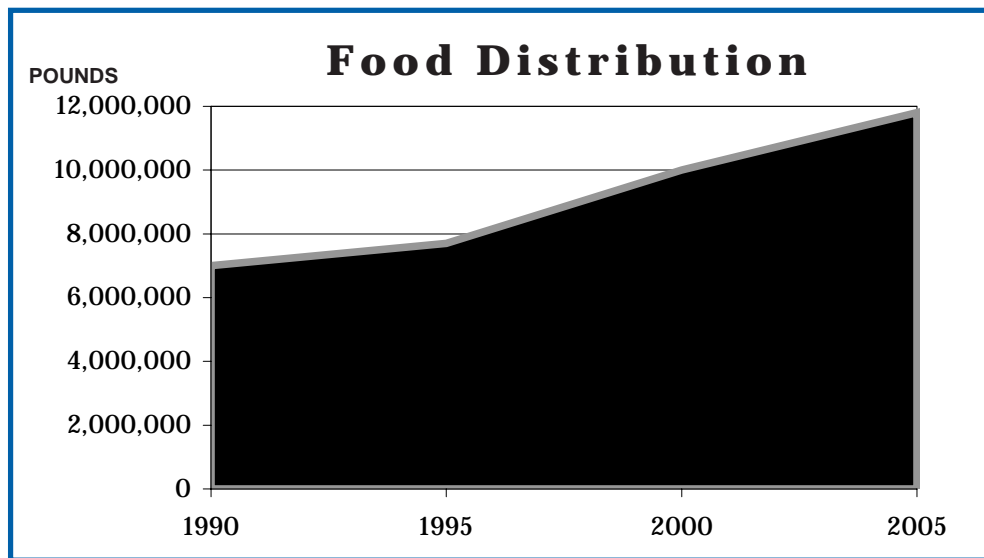
