As we close the books on fiscal year 2024, I am filled with immense gratitude and a renewed sense of purpose. This past year has been one of significant strides and unwavering commitment to our mission of building a stronger bi-state region by nourishing people, empowering communities, and transforming systems.

We remained steadfast in our efforts to provide vital food assistance to 1 in 7 people in our region facing food insecurity. This year, we continued to serve 26 counties in Missouri and Illinois, ensuring that food reached those in need across our service area.

Through the dedication of our staff, volunteers, and generous donors, we achieved several key accomplishments. We expanded our mobile food distribution program, added additional school markets to feed children and their families, and increased our access to nutritious food through partnerships with retailers and farmers.

Looking ahead, we are focused on building the Foodbank of the future as we prepare to commemorate a momentous milestone: our 50th anniversary in July 2025. We are investing in innovative technologies to improve our distribution efficiency. We are focused on aligning our programming with the unique needs of our communities, including a focus on culturally relevant and nutritious foods. We are working to reduce food waste by partnering with local retailers to collect safe and nutritious unsold food items, which can then be distributed through our network of partner agencies. And we are committed to addressing the root causes of hunger through advocacy and collaboration with community partners.





# **FOODBANK PROGRAMS**

## Food on the Move (FOTM)

Food On The Move is a walk-through, shopping-style food distribution program for individuals living in areas of Illinois and Missouri with limited access to healthy food and resources. At these distributions, neighbors can walk through our custom built trailer and choose the foods they need. Verification of personal information is not required to participate. The goal is to increase access by eliminating transportation barriers on a more regular basis. We also hope to minimize food waste by allowing people to choose quantities and products that fit their needs.

- Total # of FOTM distributions: 285
- Total FOTM pounds distributed: 480,235
- FOTM Total Individuals Served: 47,646



# **Community Mobile Markets**

Mobile markets are drive-through events that provide fresh, nutritious food and household goods directly to neighbors living in areas with limited access to fresh foods.

- Total # of mobile markets: 1,554
- Total pounds distributed through mobile markets: 8,397,424
- Total # households served through mobile markets: 86,852



## **School Markets**

St. Louis Area Foodbank's School Market initiative offers families another option for accessing the food they need by creating food pantries in local schools. Through this innovative program, neighbors can acquire nutritious food for their entire household each week.

- Total # school-based markets: 35
- Total pounds distributed to school markets: 316,977
- Total # children and families served through school markets: 15,691 children, 7,031 households
